

iRemember™ Release Notes

Version 2.5.2 — 2010-January-30

System Requirements

The following are the minimum requirements for iRemember:

- A Macintosh computer with a PowerPC G4 or G5 processor, or an Intel processor.
- Mac OS X version 10.4.11 or later, including 10.6 (Snow Leopard).
- At least 3GB of free hard disk space for installation.
- 512 MB of random-access memory (RAM) installed.
- Thousands of colors at 1024 x 768 monitor resolution.
- DVD-ROM drive required for installation.
- iLife '05 or later recommended.
- High quality inkjet printer. Printing of 12x12 scrapbooks requires a wide format printer.



Documentation

iRemember's documentation comes in two forms:

First is a set of tutorials intended for users new to iRemember. (They should be especially helpful for users new to the Macintosh.) We **strongly** recommend **all** users review our tutorials. They are easily printed, and require only 10-15 minutes each. The concepts presented far outweigh your time investment and will be utilized in every scrapbook page you create!

To access the tutorials:

1. Open the iRemember application. (Its default location is in the iRemember folder in the Applications folder.)
2. Select one of the tutorials from iRemember's "Help" menu. The tutorials begin with "101 Getting Started".

Second is a built-in, comprehensive, searchable help system designed for experienced users. It provides a complete reference guide to the program's features and functions. This documentation is provided electronically to allow it to be easily updated, inexpensive, and environmentally responsible. To access the comprehensive Help system, select "iRemember Help" from iRemember's "Help" menu.

Bug Fixes from 2.5.1 to 2.5.2 (2010-January-30)

Enhancements

- Added the new iPhoto Extra Large size to the Custom Layout Size menu.
- Arrange > Fit to Content is now a bit smarter when dealing with text.

Bug Fixes

- Corrected a bug where images in graphics that are part of a group were not being saved.
- You are now prevented from dragging an image completely out of its shape when cropping an image using Edit Content Mode.

- Corrected a bug that, under certain circumstances, would prevent a document from being saved.

New Features, Enhancements and Bug Fixes from 2.2.2 to 2.5 (2009-October-01)

New Features

- Added Arrange > Group command to combine graphics so they can be manipulated as a unit.
- Added a new Rotation Control permitting direct rotation of a shape without going to the Inspector. (Pressing the Shift key restricts the rotation to 45 degree increments.)
- Added Edit Content Mode. Double clicking on a shape that contains an image allows direct manipulation of rotation,

scaling & positioning of the embedded image. To end Edit Content Mode, click outside the embedded image. Also added the Edit > Select Contents menu command so existing users who do not read the Release Notes or Help information can (hopefully) learn about Edit Content Mode.

- Added the Right Triangle tool.
- Added the Edit > Change Shape To submenu, which allows changing an existing shape into another shape.
- Added Add & Remove buttons to the Image tab of the Inspector to provide a more intuitive way to add and remove images.
- Added Add & Remove buttons to the Fill Pattern area of the Inspector to provide a more intuitive way to add and remove fill patterns.
- Added the File > Export as PDF File command to save the current scrapbook as a PDF using the scrapbook layout size (as opposed to the File > Print > Save As PDF command, which uses the Page Setup paper size). This is especially useful when your scrapbook has a custom layout size.
- Added the Page > Save As > PDF command for exporting single pages. This command also provides an option to include or exclude a paper colored background.
- Added the ability to specify the color of a shape's shadow.
- Added a resolution quality readout for images in the Image Tab of the Inspector.
- Added a resolution quality readout for patterns in the Fill Tab of the Inspector.
- Added a tooltip showing the size or angle while creating, resizing or rotating a graphic. Similarly, resizing or rotating a shape's image (while in Edit Content Mode) displays the resolution quality of the image or its angle.
- Added Edit > Paste and Match Style command.
- Added View > Zoom to Fit and View > Zoom to Selection commands.
- Added Zoom In, Zoom Out, Zoom to Fit, and Other commands to the Zoom menu in the lower left corner of the window.
- Added Page > Go To command, making it easier to go directly to a particular page. This is especially useful when working with large scrapbooks.

Enhancements

- The meaning of the Hand tool has changed slightly. As before, clicking within an unlocked shape's embedded image begins dragging the embedded image relative to its shape. However, now clicking anywhere other than an unlocked shape's embedded image begins dragging the page, scrolling it when possible. Dragging the page never changes the selection. You cannot enter Edit Content Mode while the cursor is the hand tool.
- Resizing shapes now behaves consistently regardless of rotation. To resize about the center, press the Option key.
- Holding down the Shift key while dragging one or more graphics now restricts their placement to 90 and 45 degree intervals.
- The location of the cursor (for the various shape drawing tools) is now reflected to the rulers before "dragging out the shape" begins, allowing more accurate placement of the initial corner.
- When graphics are placed as PDFs on the clipboard, they no longer have the paper color background. In other words, PDFs are transparent when possible.
- The various Zoom commands now try to ensure the selected objects remain visible in the window.
- Arrange > Bring Forward, et.al., are no longer enabled when everything is selected.
- Arrange > Content > Center is now disabled when the content is already centered.
- Arrange > Content > Scale to Shape is now disabled when the content is already scaled properly.
- The layout page now casts a shadow on the gray desktop area.
- The minimum width and height for graphics has been reduced.

Bug Fixes

- Compatible with Mac OS X 10.6 (Snow Leopard).
- You can no longer drag a graphic completely off the page, and thereby lose it.
- All menu commands that are unreasonable while the Scrapbook Setup sheet is visible are now disabled.
- The Scrapbook Setup dialog now starts with its controls set to the values of the current document. (This does not interfere with the New Scrapbook dialog, which still starts with its controls set at the user's last chosen paper size.)
- Nudging an image (using the arrow keys) in a rotated shape now takes the rotation of the shape into account. For example, nudging right with the right arrow key moves the image right on the screen, not right relative to the shape.
- Corrected a bug where, for lines that have been rotated, dragging one of the handles also moved the opposite handle.
- Corrected a bug (occurring in several places) where pressing a modifier key (e.g., the Option key) would cause a scrollable window to scroll).
- Corrected a bug where closing a window would cause text editing in another window to stop.
